Subject: Treasurer's Report of Assets in the County Treasury for the Month Ended July 31, 2025

The Treasurer's Report of Assets in the County Treasury for the month ended July 31, 2025 is attached and is online at octreasurer.gov/publicfunds. Pursuant to California Government Code Section (GCS) 53646(b)(1) and (g), the Orange County Treasurer (Treasurer) is issuing this report listing the public funds in the County Treasury records held by the local agency to the chief executive officer, the internal auditor and the legislative body of the local agencies. This report includes the required information detailed in GCS 53646(b)(2), (3), and (4) and includes other fund account information in the County Treasury records for information purposes.

COUNTY TREASURY ASSETS

The report shows the total of all securities, investments and moneys held by the local agency recorded in the County Treasury records as of July 31, 2025. A summary page lists these public funds assets in the County Treasury records for the current month, prior month and prior year. The assets in the County Treasury in the County's custodial accounts as of July 31, 2025, consist of Cash, the Orange County Treasury Pool (OCTP), and a Bond Proceeds Account. In addition, as required to disclose per GCS 53646(b)(1), certain bond funds are held with contracted bond trustees and are not included in this summary.

NET POOL INTEREST EARNINGS APPORTIONMENT PER GCS 53647 et seq & 27013, 27133(f)

Interest on all money deposited belongs to, and shall be paid quarterly into the general fund of the local agency, unless directed by the governing board or law to be paid to another fund and administrative expense related to investing, depositing, banking, auditing, reporting or handling of the funds may be deducted prior to distribution. Monthly, the Treasurer calculates total interest earnings to be paid to the appropriate fund account. The actual cash payments for May 2025, June 2025 and July 2025 interest apportionments are expected to be paid in September 2025, October 2025, and November 2025 respectively.

TEMPORARY TRANSFERS PER CONSTITUTION ARTICLE XVI SECTION 6

The Treasurer has the power and duty pursuant to the Constitution and the Board of Supervisor's Resolution 24-011 to make temporary transfers to school districts to address their short-term cash flow needs. The loans are secured by tax receipts to be received by the County Treasurer, as the banker for the school districts. There were no temporary transfers outstanding as of July 31, 2025.

STATUS OF REQUIRED COUNTY TREASURY REPORTS AND COMPLIANCE SUMMARY

During the month of July, there were no required reports issued. As reported last month, only the quarterly report will include a detailed summary compliance report. The outstanding reports status is as follows:

Financial Reports (Pursuant to GCS 26920(a) and (b):

- 1) The Quarterly Schedule of Assets Review reports of the County Treasury for the periods ending September 30, 2024, December 31, 2024, and March 31, 2025, by the AC are in process (engagement letter updated and signed on August 4, 2025, reflecting the modified accrual basis of accounting, a change from the prior signed engagement letter with the cash modified basis of accounting).
- 2) The Annual Schedule of Assets Audit of the County Treasury for the period ending June 30, 2025, has not been started as no engagement letter has yet been received (letter expected to be received in September).

Compliance Reports on Investments (pursuant to GCS 27130 et seq and TOC By-Laws & directive):

- 1) The Annual Compliance Audit report of the County Treasury's Compliance with California Government Code Article 6 as of June 30, 2024, by an external auditor is in process (updated engagement letter signed on July 24, 2025. This updated letter removed future annual audits due to the dissolution of TOC by the Board on March 11, 2025). The annual compliance audit for the period ending December 31, 2024, to the 2024 IPS, not yet started (six-month period).
- 2) The Quarterly Compliance Monitoring reports of the County Treasury as directed by the Treasury Oversight Committee for the periods September 30, 2024, and December 31, 2024, are in process (updated engagement letter signed on July 30, 2025, and ended quarterly compliance monitoring as of 12-31-24 to the 2024 IPS due to the dissolution of the TOC by the Board on March 11, 2025).
- 3) The TOC annual written/verbal report to be presented at a public meeting for calendar year 2024 per TOC By-Laws was not completed due to dissolution of TOC on March 11, 2025 (no longer will be reported as an outstanding report).

<u>Background:</u> The GCS Article 6 Treasury Oversight Committee code section 27134 requiring an annual compliance audit and the Treasurer's requirement to report compliance per GCS Article 6 27133 et seq and GCS 53646(b)(2) are no longer applicable as the 2025 IPS submitted by the Treasurer on December 17, 2024, was not reviewed or approved by the Board as stated in GCS 53646(a)(1) and the TOC was dissolved on March 11, 2025, by the Board. A Board Resolution and a 2025 Investment Policy (IP) submitted by County Counsel on February 11, 2025, directed the County Investment Manager to report compliance with the IP and the Investment Oversight Committee (IOC) established on March 11, 2025, monitors and reviews this compliance with the IP. In addition, County Counsel stated that the TOC annual verbal/written report at a public meeting was not required for calendar year 2024 due to the dissolution and this report requirement is not included in the IOC By-Laws.

Although the above reports have been delayed, asset amounts and status in the compliance summary have been reported timely in the prior monthly Treasurer's reports. As stated last month and as allowed by GCS 53646(b)(4), the Treasurer will report the detailed subsidiary ledger of investments and the compliance summary on a quarterly basis versus the monthly method used previously and expects to continue to provide a condensed monthly report highlighting key County Treasury assets and other information.

CERTIFICATION OF COUNTY TREASURY RECORDS PER GCS 53646(b)(3)

I certify that this report includes the cash and investments in the records of the County Treasury maintained by the Treasurer as of July 31, 2025. Based on the Treasurer's pooled cash forecast that includes estimated deposits, estimated withdrawals and investment maturities, the local agencies have the ability to meet the pooled funds' expected expenditures for the next six months. 






ORANGE COUNTY INVESTMENT POOL COMPOSITION BY ACCOUNTING FUND AS OF JULY 31, 2025

ORANGE COUNTY TREASURER-TAX COLLECTOR CASH AVAILABILITY PROJECTION

FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDING JANUARY 31, 2026

The OCTP consists of funds in the County Treasury deposited by various entities required to do so by statute. The Treasurer, shall have the power and duty pursuant to Constitution Article XVI Section 6 and the Board of Supervisor's Resolution 24-011, to make temporary transfers to school districts to address their short-term cash needs. The loans are secured by tax receipts to be received by the County Treasurer, as the banker for the school districts. As reported, there were no temporary transfers outstanding as of July 31, 2025.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 29808, the Auditor-Controller may direct that amounts authorized by order, requisition, or other means be transferred from the accounts or funds of any district, public corporation, or public agency into one or more clearing funds in the County Treasury. This is for the purpose of enabling warrants for such entities to be drawn against the designated clearing funds. Legal investments made by the Board of Supervisors, acting in a fiduciary capacity, are not subject to this provision except to the extent funds are transferred into clearing accounts under this section.

The Treasurer, in the projection of cash availability to disburse funds as directed by the Auditor-Controller and the Department of Education, is primarily relying on historical trends involving deposits and withdrawals and known future cash flows. No representation is made as to an individual depositor's ability to meet their anticipated expenditures with anticipated revenues.

The Cash Availability Projection for the six months ending January 31, 2026, indicates the ability of the pool to meet projected expenditures. However, there will usually be differences between projected and actual results because events and circumstances frequently do not occur as expected and those differences may be material.
